This format is for demonstrating live simulation scenarios, computer-based simulations, virtual patients, virtual/augmented reality, homemade simulators, and other tools or techniques.

**For those who would like to submit a video screening, please consider submitting an abstract for an innovation demonstration and providing a QR code/link to access the video via smartphone.*

Demonstrations will be integrated into the Expo program in various ways, depending on the numbers of proposals we receive and the nature of the demonstrations. For example, this may include:

- A dedicated ‘demonstration showcase’ session where delegates freely circulate among demonstration stations.
- The ‘SIM-in-Action’ format where delegates rotate on a timed schedule.
- Integration into the poster presentation session.
- A single 10-15 min demonstration at a specified point in time, in the plenary room or other common space.

Please indicate to us the structure and format of your proposed demonstration, so we can integrate it into the Expo program as effectively as possible. Upon abstract acceptance, we will provide more information about the timing and format of your demonstration. We may need to suggest a modification to fit the Expo program.

Innovation Demonstration Abstract Structure

Abstracts must include:

- 1) Rationale/impetus for the innovation;
- 2) Goal or learning objectives;
- 3) Description of the innovation;
- 4) Summary of usage/evaluation; and
- 5) Your vision for the demo format (e.g., physical demo on a tabletop; virtual demo using a computer; live demonstration of a sim scenario acted out; etc.).
