We accept manikin-based scenarios, standardized patient scenarios, moulage, team crises, demonstrations of homemade simulators, virtual sims, VR/AR demos, and hybrids.

The exact session format and structure will be determined based on the nature of the presentations we accept. Please provide enough detail in your abstract that we can envision how your demonstration will work.

A laptop and screen will be available if your demonstration is assigned to one of the breakout rooms; let us know if this is a requirement for you. **Any other equipment must be supplied by the presenters.**

- 1) The rationale/objectives of your innovation;
- 2) The description of the simulation itself;
- 3) How the demonstration will work;
- 4) What participants will experience; and
- 5) All onsite equipment required.
